

Select **General Interest > Other Programs**. You can also access the Invention Developer Services page by selecting **General Interest > Invention Developers**.




Figure 1. General Interest > Invention Developer Services

This takes you to the main Invention Developer Services page.




Figure 2. Invention Developer Services page

### **Invention Developer Services**

This <u>Invention Developer Services</u> page contains links and contact information for the Invention Developer Services office.

The first thing you'll notice is the large stock image at the top with a statement for invention developers: "Invention developers doing business in North Carolina are required to make specific disclosures and utilize statutory terms in their contracts with their clients. In addition, Invention Developers must maintain a bond issued by a surety company and file a copy of the bond with the Secretary of State before the invention developer begins business in North Carolina."




Figure 3. Browse Invention Developer Services

#### **General Information**

The General Information page has information for inventors and invention developers alike.

#### Why do invention developers need a surety bond?

The surety bond is required as a deterrent for fraudulent behavior and protects the inventor who enters a contract for invention development services with the invention developer. The bond benefits the person entering into a contract for invention development services should they be damaged by fraud, dishonesty, or the invention developer's failure to provide services after entering a contract. In other words, a surety bond is a safety net for inventors who enter a contract with an invention developer. It's also a deterrent for unethical behavior.

#### Non-Compliance = Court

Invention developers who fail to comply with the requirements of mandatory disclosure and contracting in N.C.G.S. 66-209 at seq. may end up in court. Their client may utilize specific statutory civil remedies, including treble damages and attorney's fees. Also, in the event that an apparent violation is discovered by the North Carolina Secretary of State, a case referral will be made to the North Carolina Attorney General who is empowered to obtain injunctive relief and also to recover a civil penalty up to \$25,000.00.

#### Who qualifies as an invention developer?

The general rule is one who is "an individual, firm, partnership, or corporation, or an agent, employee, officer, partner, or independent contractor of one of those entities that offers to perform or performs Invention development services for a customer."

#### Who is exempt from this rule?

However, please note the following categories of persons for purposes of this law are NOT included in this general rule:

a. A department or agency of the federal, State, or local government;

b. A charitable, scientific, educational, religious, or other organization qualified under <u>G.S. 105</u> <u>130.9</u> or described in <u>Section 170(b)(1)(A)</u> of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; (Internal Revenue Charities Search) https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/search-forcharities)

c. A person registered before the United States Patent and Trademark Office acting solely within the scope of that person's professional license:(U.S. Patent and Trademark Patent Customer Services) <u>https://www.uspto.gov/about-us/organizational-offices/office-commissioner-patents/office-deputy-commissioner-patent-administration/office-innovation-development</u>

d. A person, firm, corporation, association, or other entity that does not charge a fee, including reimbursement for expenditures made or costs incurred by the entity, for invention development services other than payment made from a portion of the income received by a customer by virtue of the acts performed by the entity; or

e. An attorney licensed to practice law in North Carolina acting solely within the scope of that person's professional license. (N.C. State Bar Attorney Listing https://www.ncbar.gov/for-the-public/finding-a-lawyer/member-directory/ and the Attorney Referral Service https://www.ncbar.gov/for-the-public/finding-a-lawyer/)

#### **Finding Legal Services**

**The North Carolina Secretary of State cannot provide legal services.** If you need legal services relating to Invention Development, please consult your own attorney.

There is no charge for receiving a referral from this Attorney Referral Service, but if calling from out of state, there is a toll charge for the long distance phone call. When calling the attorney you are referred to, most attorneys charge a \$30.00 fee, which entitles the caller to a 30 minute consultation with the attorney. Callers should clarify the consultation fee in advance with the attorney.

#### What is an Invention Developer?

An invention developer is an individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or an agent, employee, officer, partner, or independent contractor of one of those entities, that offers to perform or performs invention development services for a customer and that is not:

- A department or agency of the federal, state, or local government;
- A charitable, scientific, educational, religious, or other organization qualified under N.C.G.S. 105-130.9 or described in Section 170(b)(1)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;
- A person registered before the United States Patent and Trademark Office acting solely within the scope of that person's professional license;
- A person, firm, corporation, association, or other entity that does not charge a fee, including reimbursement for expenditures made or costs incurred by the entity, for invention development services other than payment made from a portion of the income received by a customer by virtue of the acts performed by the entity; or
- An attorney licensed to practice law in North Carolina acting solely within the scope of that person's professional license.

#### What is Invention Development Services?

Invention Development Services means any act done by or for an invention developer for the procurement or attempted procurement by the invention developer of a license or buyer of an intellectual property right in an invention. The term includes the evaluation, perfecting, marketing, brokering, or promoting of an invention, a patent search, and preparation or prosecution of a patent application by a person not registered to practice before the United States Patent and Trademark Office.

#### What are the financial requirements?

Each invention developer doing business in this State as defined by the North Carolina General Statutes shall maintain a bond issued by a surety company authorized to do business in this State. The principal sum of the bond must be at least five percent (5%) of the invention developer's gross income from the invention development business in this State during the invention developer's last fiscal year or twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), whichever is greater. The invention developer shall file a copy of the bond with the Secretary of State before the day on which the invention developer begins business in this State.

The invention developer shall have 90 days after the end of each fiscal year within which to change the bond as may be necessary to conform to the requirement. The bond required must be in favor of the State of North Carolina for the benefit of any person who, after entering into a contract for invention development services with an invention developer is damaged by fraud, dishonesty, or failure to provide the services of the invention developer in performance of the contract. Any person claiming against the bond may maintain an action at law against the

invention developer and surety. The aggregate liability of the surety to all persons for all breaches of conditions of the bond required is limited to the amount of the bond.

## Is there an alternate method for securing protection of someone contracting with an invention developer?

Instead of furnishing the bond required, the invention developer may deposit with the Secretary of State a cash deposit equal to the amount of the bond required. The cash deposit may be satisfied by:

- Certificates of deposit payable to the Secretary of State issued by banks doing business in this State and insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation;
- Investment certificates of share accounts assigned to the Secretary of State and issued by a savings and loan association doing business in this State, and insured by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation; or
- Cash deposit with the Secretary of State

## Is there a form required to be submitted to the Secretary of State with the copy of the surety bond?

Yes, you may download a copy of the <u>Invention Developer Submission Form</u> at this link or from the <u>Invention Developers Services page</u>. <u>Bond</u> and <u>certificate of deposit</u> forms are available here as well.

#### Is there a fee for supplying the copy of the bond?

No.

## How and where can the copy of the bonds be submitted to the North Carolina Secretary of State's office?

You may submit a copy of the bond to the Secretary of State's Office by fax (919) 807-2010 or by mail PO Box 29622, Raleigh, NC 27626-0622 to the attention of "Invention Developer."

#### Where can I find the statutes governing the Invention Developer?

<u>North Carolina General Statutes Article 29 of Chapter 66</u> governs Invention Development Services.

#### How may I report an invention developer not in compliance with this statute?

Fill out and mail the <u>Invention Developer Inquiry Form</u> to: Secretary of State's Office by fax (919-807-2010) or by mailing to PO Box 29622, Raleigh, NC 27626-0622 to the Attention of Invention Developer.
