Fast Five Q &A

Q: I have an enotary class coming up. Where can I find the book? I checked on the SOS website, but I couldn't find a manual.

Congratulations on taking this course! The educational institution where you are taking the eNotary course will provide the Electronic Notary Public Manual as part of the course offering. Please contact the institution for information on how the eNotary Manual will be delivered to you.

Q. A question sent to us via email: I know I need to keep a notary journal, but does the person have to appear before me before I complete the entry?

Yes. The signer will already be in your presence in order for you to perform the notarial act so nothing has changed there.

The information you record in the journal is related to the document you are notarizing (type of document, type of notarization, etc.) and the individual appearing before you (name, date, time, signature, etc.). So in order to

properly and accurately complete the journal, the signer will need to be in your presence with the document.

Q: From the Facebook group: I have been asked to notarize an out-ofstate car title. The seller lives out of state, but she's in town for this week only, and has asked for my help. Can I do this?

Yes. You may notarize a document destined for another state as long as the notarization takes place in North Carolina where you are a commissioned notary.

Be aware that many states DO NOT require their car titles to be notarized. If you are unsure about how to notarize a car title is best to refer the individual to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Q: What are the main parts that a notary needs to fill in on a notarial certificate for acknowledgement?

The NC county where the notarial act takes place.

The name of the person who acknowledged the signature.

The date of the notarial act.

The notary's signature.

The notary seal. The seal authenticates the notarial act.

The commission expiration date.

Q: For an Emergency Video Notarization (EVN), can a notary perform a notarization by viewing a pre-recorded video or listening to pre-recorded audio of a person signing a document?

No. Both the notary and the signer must be logged in on a video conference platform (Zoom, Webex, GoToMeeting, etc.) in real-time (live) so they can interact and see **and** hear each other clearly.

The sunset date for conducting emergency video notarizations is now December 31, 2021.

Register of Deeds Offices:


Well, what are you waiting for? More than 7,965 notaries around the state are in the group. If you haven't joined yet, click the link and come on in!
