


Remote Online Notarization

As we have discussed in this newsletter on multiple occasions, the Secretary of State's Office has been working with and providing technical support to a stakeholder group working on making a remote online notarization (RON) law permanent. The current emergency video notarization law has been extended through December 31st of this year.

The Senate has filed its version of a permanent RON bill, and the House is expected to file its version in the next few weeks. The agency has been providing technical input to both House and Senate staff. We anticipate the two versions will be different.

We will keep you updated when a bill starts to move in committee and provide you additional information as we know it.



Fast Five Q &A

Q: As a notary, are we allowed to cross out and initial a mistake on a notary certificate?

The answer is yes. Strike through any error and add the correction as close to the original error as possible. It is wise to initial and date next to the correction. It is the notary's responsibility to ensure that all information in the notary certificate is correct before affixing the notary signature and seal.

Remember that the notary should NEVER make any corrections or changes to the document or the signature lines on the document.

Q. A question sent to us via email: What if the document that I'm asked to notarize doesn't have a notarization section? Do I just write it out by hand?

When a document is presented without notarial wording on it, the notary must ask the principal, "What type of notarization would you like?".

If the signer does not know, the law authorizes notaries to offer them a selection of statutory certificates they can choose from. Once the signer selects the type of notarial act, the notary may hand write it on the document or attach a notary certificate to the back of the signature page and complete it.

Q: From the Facebook group: Is it allowable for a Notary Public to notarize the signature of their parent for a City Residential Building Permit for the building of a wheelchair ramp at their private home where the parents are disabled? The notary will NOT receive any financial benefit from this document, other than being able to help family members.

Although the law does not prohibit notaries from notarizing for family members, it is a BEST PRACTICE to refrain from doing so if possible.

Often times, family members will have a financial or beneficial interest, which would disqualify the notary. But even in instances where there is no interest, it is recommended that a notary with no family ties perform the notarization to limit any potential future challenges to the execution of the document.

Q: Is there a state requirement on the pen color that notaries must use?

There are no official requirements, but it is customary business practice to use pens with blue or black ink.

Q: Are notaries allowed to take a signer's acknowledgment over the telephone or by email?

No, you may not take an acknowledgment over the telephone or by email.

The sunset date for conducting emergency video notarizations is now December 31, 2021.

Register of Deeds Offices:

Notaries must contact the Register of Deeds Office in their county of residence about their hours of operation during the coronavirus pandemic. Some of these offices are accepting walk-ins while others are requiring appointments.

And, don't forget to put these places on your bucket list for when you are ready to jet set again!


